In 2012-13, Oregon rated CMS Level 3, meaning that our students perform about as well as other schools on standardized tests. Our student's growth in Reading and Math is above average. There has been a slight drop in the percentage of students meeting or exceeding Reading tests.

CMS offers Industrial Technology, Family & Consumer Studies, Art, Advanced Computers, Digital Photography, Choir, Drama, Band and Leadership.

We plan to strengthen our Reading Program by implementing the Common Core State Standards. Our teachers work in teams to continuously improve the quality of instruction, interventions and enrichment. CMS offers specialized classes and interventions in

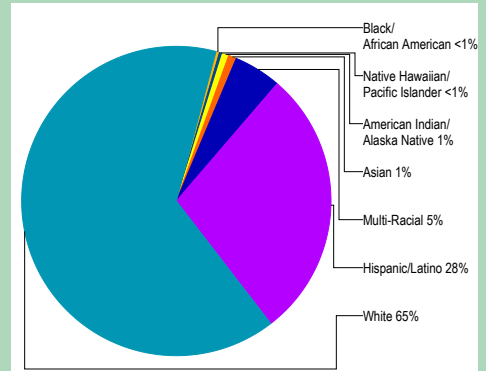

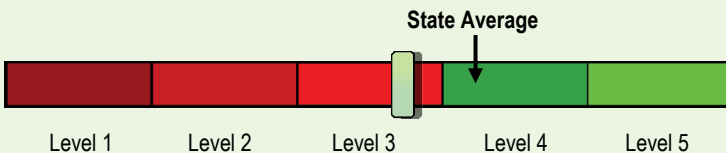


OVERALL STATE RATING

HOW ARE STUDENTS AT THIS SCHOOL PERFORMING COMPARED TO THOSE AT OTHER SCHOOLS?

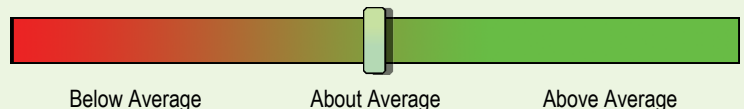
The overall state rating is intended to summarize this school's particular successes and challenges. It is based on a combination of up to five factors. Three of these factors come from standardized test scores in reading and math: student achievement, student growth, and the growth of underserved subgroups. Please be aware that this rating is based mainly on high-stakes testing and accordingly, represents a limited view of student performance. Other aspects of this report card are designed to put this rating in the proper context.

Compared to all schools statewide in 2012-13, this school is rated as Level 3.



- Level 1** = Falls into the bottom 5% of schools
- Level 2** = Falls between 5% and 15% of schools
- Level 3** = Falls between 15% and 44% of schools
- Level 4** = Falls between 44% and 90% of schools
- Level 5** = Falls into the top 10% of schools
